Direct radionuclide cystography

Department of the test: Nuclear Medicine (NM)

Purpose of the test: to detect/exclude urinary reflux from urinary bladder to ureter(s).

Notes before the test:

- 1. You will have some radiation in this test.
- 2. Catheterization is necessary. Diaper is necessary for young pediatric patients.
- 3. Please don't bring pregnant woman or children with you. We don't want to expose them to unnecessary radiation.

Procedure of the test:

- 1. Please check in fist at NM service counter.
- 2. You will be asked to lie down on the imaging bed.
- 3. NM physician will infuse a dose of radioactive tracer through the catheter.
- 4. Some saline (warmed to room temperature) will be infused into the bladder.
- 5. You will be asked to void after NM staff remove the catheter if the bladder is filled or you need to void.
- 6. Pictures are taken continuously after the infusion of a radioactive tracer through the catheter until voiding complete.

Total duration of the test: About one hour.

Adverse drug effect of the test: Very rare.

Complication: Tear of urinary bladder is rarely happened. Surgical repair is necessary if it occurs.
